# BACHELOR OF EDUCATION IN Early Childhood Education





Oklahoma is a national leader in early childhood education, and OU-Tulsa is committed to improving services for young children and their families across our community through our Bachelor of Education in Early Childhood Education degree completion program. This degree program provides junior and senior level courses needed to complete a bachelor's degree after students finish their initial two years of study with our program partner, Tulsa Community College, or at another university.

## The OU-Tulsa ECE program offers several unique features, including

- The program can be completed in five semesters, including a summer semester.
- Students begin the program in the fall semester and complete the program, including student teaching, in the second spring semester.



- The program focuses on a comprehensive range of young children from birth through age 8, with nine credit hours dedicated to infant/toddler course work.
- The program is designed for working adults, with most courses scheduled for evenings or occasional weekend classes on the OU-Tulsa campus.
- ECE students can complete at least one field experience with the following age groups: infants/toddlers, preschoolers, and primary grade-level children.

#### GEORGE KAISER FAMILY FOUNDATION LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM

All students who are admitted to the OU-Tulsa Early Childhood Education program are eligible to apply for the George Kaiser Foundation Loan Forgiveness Program. The program provides an in-state tuition waiver from the University of Oklahoma for required early childhood education courses taken at OU-Tulsa. The GKFF Loan Forgiveness Program allows students the choice between two options.

### **OPTION ONE**

### Full 100% loan forgiveness is available to students who choose to teach

- children from birth through age 4
- in licensed nonprofit agency settings such as Head Start and Tulsa Educare (excluding public school settings)
- within Tulsa county

Students receive 25% loan forgiveness per year for 4 consecutive years of employment (12 consecutive months per year) post graduation. Contact us for a list of qualified work settings.

### **OPTION TWO**

### Partial 20% loan forgiveness is available to students who choose to teach

- children from birth through grade 3
- in public or private school systems or for profit, non-subsidized agencies/schools
- within Tulsa county

Students receive 5% loan forgiveness per year for up to 4 consecutive years of employment (12 consecutive months per year) post graduation.

Those not eligible for 100% loan forgiveness may be eligible for the Inspire to Teach Employment Incentive Program, which offers a scholarship and yearly stipend for 5 years of qualified employment.
