

## R2T4 FOR MODULES FACT SHEET

A module is a course which does not span the entire length of the enrollment period.

A student is considered to be withdrawn if the student does not complete all of the days in the payment period that the student was scheduled to complete.

If a student officially drops courses in a later module while still attending a current module, the student is not considered as withdrawn based on not attending a later module. However, a recalculation of aid, based on a change in enrollment, may still be required.

Students who provide written confirmation at the time of ceasing attendance of plans to attend another course later in the same payment period are not considered to have withdrawn from the term. If the student does not provide written confirmation of plans to return to school later in the same payment period or term, OU considers the student to have withdrawn and begins the R2T4 calculation.

However, if the student does return to OU in the same term, even if they did not provide written confirmation of plans to do so, the student is not considered to have withdrawn after all and is eligible to receive the Title IV funds for which the student was eligible before ceasing attendance. FAS will then reverse the R2T4 process and provide additional funds that the student is eligible to receive at the time of return.

If a student successfully completes at least one module, the student will not be suspended. The student will go through the regular satisfactory academic progress review at the end of the year unless the student is on probation.

If a student successfully completes at least one module, our office will not cancel aid for the next semester.

Students will be notified of the results of a recalculation for dropped courses by receiving a revised OU FAN. Students withdrawing from the university will receive both a revised OU FAN and an individual letter regarding necessary repayment of funds, unless the student attended past the 60% completion point.
