OVERVIEW OF PANEL

The Tribal Engagement 101 seminar introduces participants to Tribal Nations and their unique identities, histories, and government structures, with a focus on understanding the basics of tribal sovereignty. The webinar highlights the historical framework of U.S. tribal relations, as well as the federal government's unique government-to-government relationship with Tribal Nations. This webinar then explores the importance of building respectful and collaborative relationships between Tribal Nations and the University of Oklahoma. It emphasizes the significance of honoring tribal sovereignty, engaging in meaningful consultation, and fostering mutual partnerships that benefit all parties involved. Participants learn about the best practices for effective communication and will consider strategies to promote reciprocity. The overall goal is to cultivate positive and sustainable university relationships that support and respect Tribal Nations, their sovereignty, and their priorities.
