
- Agency Mission: conserve, protect, and restore
 Oklahoma's natural resources, working in
 collaboration with conservation districts and other
 partners, on behalf of the citizens of Oklahoma
- Programs include: Abandoned Coal Mine Reclamation, Conservation Programs, District Services, Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services, and Water Quality (WQ)

WQ Monitoring for Nonpoint Source Pollution

- Monitor 250 small mostly perennial (3 – 5 order) streams across the state
- Monitor physical, chemical, and biological conditions on each site for 2 of every 5 years
- Monitor upstream of permitted discharges, reservoirs, confluences, etc. to focus on NPS
- Focus on pollutants for which the state has quantitative water quality standards, also includes nutrients
- Funded significantly with EPA CWA 319
