AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Legislation related to the Student
Environmental Coalition, providing for short title,
providing for codification, and providing for an effective
date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT
ASSOCIATION:

- Section 1:** Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Removal of the Student Environmental Coalition Act”
- Section 2:** Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to remove the Student Environmental Coalition from the OUSGA Code Annotated to pass the responsibility to the Congress Sustainability Committee.
- Section 3:** AMENDATORY: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association Code Annotated § Title IX, Chapter 4 will be amended as follows, with ~~strike through~~ indicating a removed section, and underline indicating added sections.

~~Chapter IX 4 Student Environmental Coalition~~

~~Delegation Purpose. The SGA Student Environmental Coalition, “SEC,” will ensure that various environmental groups communicate well to accomplish goals in the most effective way possible and serve as environmental advisors to the campus at large.~~

~~Membership Requirements and Responsibilities. All students currently enrolled at the University of Oklahoma shall be eligible to serve as a representative for any campus environmental initiative, RSO, or non-student organization. Faculty and staff are also eligible to serve on the coalition in order to speak for university based initiatives. Students must remain in good standing with the University.~~

~~Officers. The officers of the organization shall be Chair, Vice-Chair, and Secretary.~~

~~Eligibility. Members of SEC in good academic standing will be eligible to run for office; the chair of SEC must have adequate time to devote towards stewarding the council.~~

~~Selection. SEC Officers will be elected by a majority vote of current SEC members. Current SEC members shall be defined as members who have attended at least sixty percent of the meetings of the previous semester.~~

~~Term Length and Limit. All SEC Officers will be elected for one academic year. With exception of the Chair, officers may serve more than one academic year, but they shall be reelected by the coalition each year.~~

~~Responsibilities. The Officers will work closely with the SGA and, most importantly, the various Registered Student Organizations related to Environmental Sustainability to ensure the mission of SEC is actualized.~~

~~Vacancies. If a vacancy arises, an interim officer will be chosen by the current members of the SEC by majority vote or consensus. The coalition will decide how officer responsibilities will be transferred for the remainder of the academic year.~~

~~Officer Removal. The SEC shall have the authority to remove an officer with a simple majority with the advice and consent of the legislature.~~

~~Internal Proceedings. The Student Environmental Coalition shall establish rules of procedure for the internal operations for the organization. These rules shall be published and available to students upon request. Any proposed and adopted rule changes must be sent to the SGA President, Graduate Student Senate Chair, Chair of the Undergraduate Student Congress, and Campus Activities Council Chair.~~

~~Meetings~~

~~Meeting Times. The chair of the SEC shall establish meeting times for the full academic semester by the third academic week of each semester. The meetings shall be open to the public and minutes will be recorded by the secretary for future records.~~

~~Attendance. The SEC shall function as a resource to members. Responsibility to attend shall be strongly advocated for by the officers. SEC members must attend at least sixty percent of the meetings in order to vote in officer elections~~

~~Power and Authority. The SEC shall be empowered to create any such committees, boards, commissions, or other such entities that it deems are necessary to further its purpose.~~

~~Funding. The SGA Student Environmental Coalition shall be provided financial support through the Executive Branch.~~

Section 4: This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.

CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION CR-110-09
SENATE RESOLUTION NO. GF23-26

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution recommending that OU provide a textbooks-in-tuition program; and providing for distribution.

- Whereas: The price of textbooks is currently separate from the cost of tuition at the University of Oklahoma, purchased through a secondary source; and
- Whereas: Textbooks-in-tuition program is currently primarily implemented at private schools and aviation schools, including Thomas More College in Kentucky, Schreiner University in Texas, and Spartan College of Aeronautics, as well as other low-enrollment colleges and technical schools¹; and
- Whereas: The University of Oklahoma will benefit from the implementation of an all-inclusive program by retaining unused funds from textbooks when students fail to withdraw from classes on time or by the final drop date to receive a “W”; and
- Whereas: The students will benefit from the implementation of the all-inclusive program by receiving 25% - 100% refund on textbooks purchased when classes are dropped on time; and
- Whereas: The University of Oklahoma would be one of the first Division I schools to implement this type of all-inclusive textbooks-in-tuition program; and
- Whereas: The implementation of the textbooks-in-tuition program would benefit the veteran and their dependents/spouses. Veteran’s benefits have permissible mandatory charges assessed by a school (other than tuition and room and board) that are necessary for the pursuit of an approved program of education and are the same amount for all students (GI Bill and non-

GI bill). Mandatory fees may be for items, such as books, that could be obtained from a source other than the school as long as the fee is assessed to all students²; and

Whereas: Textbooks would arrive on/or before start of classes with implementation of the textbooks-in-tuition program. Textbooks often arrive three to four weeks into the semester when purchased through a secondary source; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the “Only One Textbooks and Tuition All Inclusive Act.”

Section 2: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association has already communicated with the OU Division of Enrollment Management and suggested adoption of the following logistics for this program:

- 1) Include textbook costs with tuition costs during each enrollment term for interested students.
Specific benchmarks related to withdrawal timelines and the refund that students are eligible for.

Section 3: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association recommends that the OU Division of Enrollment Management communicate and coordinate with Student Government Association when building out this program, including logistical decisions such as book conditions, infrastructure for handling student issues and complaints, integration with online textbooks or textbook platforms, and other issues that may impact students.

A Concurrent Resolution Recognizing November 11th as
Veterans Day; and providing for distribution.

- Whereas: In 1954, Congress passed a bill that President Eisenhower signed, proclaiming November 11th as Veterans Day; and,
- Whereas: Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans, whether during times of peace or war; and,
- Whereas: Last year, there were 244,334 veterans living in the state of Oklahoma¹; and,
- Whereas: Out of those 244,334 veterans, approximately 104,000 have some form of service-connected disability²; and,
- Whereas: The approximate number of enrolled veterans at the University of Oklahoma, Norman campus, and the University of Oklahoma, Tulsa campus, equals 1,600; and,
- Whereas: The University of Oklahoma offers resources to veteran's on campus such as Veteran Student Services, which provides financial help, counseling, healthcare resources, and more; and,
- Whereas: Veterans Day is not a recognized holiday under the University of Oklahoma's calendared events or publications.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT
CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution recognizing the month of
November as Native American Heritage Month and
providing for distribution.

- Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is celebrated during the month of November; and,
- Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is used to promote the identities and culture of Indigenous Peoples³; and,
- Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is also used to educate the general public on the challenges Native peoples have faced throughout history and today; and,
- Whereas: Native American Heritage Month was first recognized by the United States federal government in 1990⁴; and,
- Whereas: 9.5% of the State of Oklahoma's population identifies as American Indian and Alaskan Native; and,
- Whereas: 6.7% of the State of Oklahoma's population identifies with Two or more races which may include American Indian and Alaskan Native; and,
- Whereas: Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander makes up 0.3% of Oklahoma's state population⁵; and,
- Whereas: As of Fall 2023, The University of Oklahoma had about 29,166 students enrolled across all campuses; and,
- Whereas: 1,107 of those students identified as American Indian or Alaskan Native; and,
- Whereas: 2,649 students identified as biracial which does include any American Indian students who identify as such⁶; and,
- Whereas: 30 students identify as Hawaiian Native/Pacific Islander at the University of Oklahoma; and,

Whereas: Some people of Native heritage do not specify their race when asked, and as a result, these percentages may be inaccurate; and,

Whereas: The University of Oklahoma currently resides on the traditional home of the Caddo and Wichita nations. As well as once being a part of the Muscogee Creek and Seminole nations⁷; and,

Whereas: Suppression, assimilation, and removal of Native Peoples and their culture were official policies by early state and federal settlement laws⁸; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the “Native American Heritage Month Recognition Resolution of 2023.”

Section 2: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize the month of November as Native American Heritage Month.

Section 3: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize and honor the Native American students at The University of Oklahoma in addition to their culture and heritage.

Section 4: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize that the University of Oklahoma resides on traditional Native American land.

Section 5: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall condemn any laws and policies that have or currently suppressed, harmed, and/or denounced any Native peoples, as well as their culture and heritage.
